Award Component: a \$500 scholarship and individual certificate

Criteria:

- 1. Applicant must be a Joplin High School Senior
- 2. Applicant must be a graduating high school senior in the year of the award.
- 3. Applicant must have attended Eastmorland Elementary for at least 1 year of their primary education.

Application Process: (Applicant Must Submit)

- 1. Completed typed application form (handwritten and/or incomplete applications will not be processed).
- 2. Letter of application address to the Scholarship Committee. The letter should contain a brief explanation of career goals and biographical (background) information.
- 3. One (1) letter of recommendation from the student's high school teacher, administrator, or former employer.
- 4. A complete high school transcript with cumulative grade point averages and a class standing/rank.
